Trina Bilal (Class of 2025 Parent)

Why do you want to serve on the Nominating Committee?

I would like to help TJHSST recruit and select a passionate, dedicated, and dynamic slate of PTSA candidates who are focused on cultivating enriching and engaging activities/programs that further enhance the educational and cultural experiences of TJ students, parents, and teachers.

Brief Bio (tell us who you are, what experience you have if any with PTSAs or other volunteer or related experience)

My name is Trina Bilal. My son, Kaiwan "Kai" Bilal is a freshman at TJHSST. I have an extensive amount of experience with PTSAs as I've been very active in supporting my son's elementary, middle, and high school PTSAs. Additionally, I support a plethora of volunteer organizations focused on advancing STEM education and collegiate research and development initiatives targeted towards underrepresented communities via professional and personal affiliations.

Cherry Li (Class of 2023 Parent)

Why do you want to serve on the Nominating Committee?

Because I care for the wellbeing of this community, and I wish to contribute my strengths and perspective in selecting the new board. I have a vision for a PTSA that goes beyond the political convictions of the parents, with a focus to foster a safe environment where the whole community can thrive, be it the students, teachers and administrators.

Brief Bio (tell us who you are, what experience you have if any with PTSAs or other volunteer or related experience)

Like many immigrants in northern Virginia, I came to the US to obtain my advanced degree and eventually became a proud US citizen, supporting biomedical research. I had moved to Fairfax County when my son was in first grade and I saw first hand that the intellectual needs of gifted children are not met in public schools, even in the Advanced Academic Program. On the other hand, when my son was admitted by TJ, a school designated for gifted education, I was ambivalent because TJ has a reputation of being unhealthy for the mental and emotional states of its students. In an effort to change that, I had co-organized a parenting workshop at TJ with the then PTSA parent support committee, to raise awareness of the social and emotional needs of developing adolescents. In June last year I had discovered that the TJPTSA was rendered dysfunctional in the wake of the controversial admission policy reform. I believed in the mission of TJPTSA and started a petition to save our PTSA with a few other parents. Since then I have taken all the opportunities to help heal this community. I had joined TJAB with the hope that TJAB would fill the void of community building; I helped with PTSA election to put PTSA back on track, and I helped with organizing the first in person event in school in 2 years, the Lunar New Year celebration, which showcased our community spirit and unity. I'm a firm believer of compassion in dealing with the challenges our community is facing, and I will help elect a board that reflects that value.
