 - o Dr. Gupta, a 1992 graduate, and Dr. Randolph, a 1995 graduate entered FCPS Hall of Fame

SGA Report - Chinmay (VP)

Treasurer's Report & Proposed Budget Revision - Nell Janardhan

- Exceeded revenue goals and stayed below expense goals. PTSA net income as of 4/10 is \$18K; estimated ending balance is \$21K
- ANGP net income as of 4/10 is \$34.8K;
- PTSA board has approved to move funding across categories which doesn't change the overall expenses

Printed Directory Recommendation for 2023-2024: Yvette Rivers

- Went through Printed Directory presentation again in case anyone missed last time and also to make sure the factors are fresh in everyone's minds
- The reason we are discussing and deciding on this now is that the company that we contract for the printing of this directory has asked the President to sign the contract now for next year, so this is our way of getting membership input before making that decision
- Traditionally, the TJHSST PTSA has provided a service to TJ families by producing a printed Student Directory that automatically includes all registered students in grades 9-12 unless their parent/guardian opts them out. The PTSA also offers an online and searchable version of this directory that includes all the same information as the Printed Directory, but in a different format.
- In the fall of every year, prior to printing the directory, parents/guardians who have not opted out are asked several times to login to verify data, update their contact information, and review/update their opt-out preferences.
- Pros of printed directory were presented.
- Cons of printed directory were presented.
- Board recommends NOT printing the student directory next year and promoting online student directory instead.
- On behalf of the TJPTSA Board, 2nd VP moved that the PTSA will only publish an online student directory for the 2023-2024 school year.
- Christina Collins: I'm a senior student's parent. In favor of printed directory. It's handy. Willing to pay
 more for it. Love the feature to allow finding people by zip codes. There might be ways to streamline the
 process.
- The Board's motion passed with 15 in favor, 11 opposed, and 4 abstaining.
